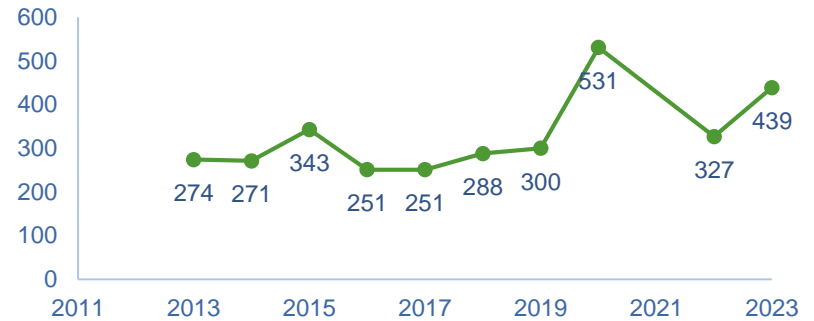

2013-2023 Chronically Homeless Trend

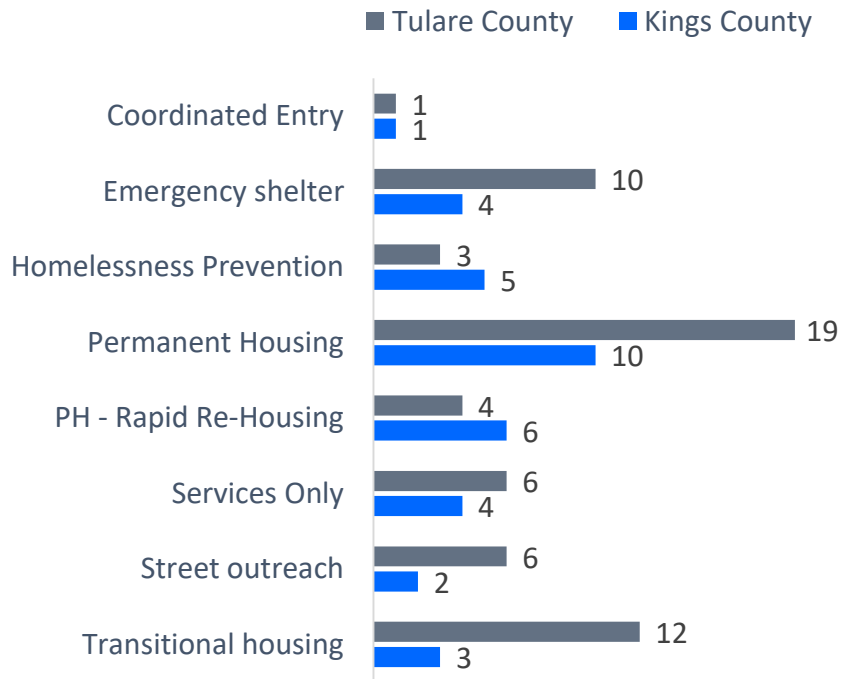


Homeless Management Information System

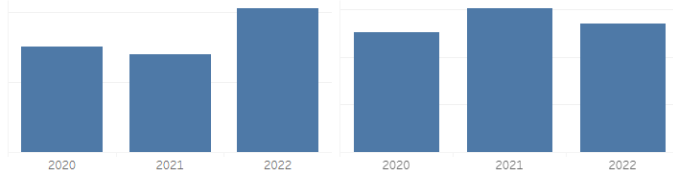

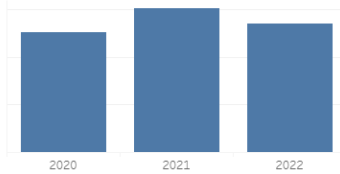

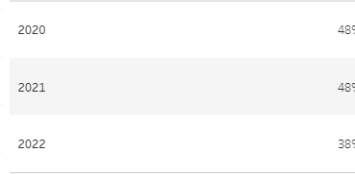
Client Served Count



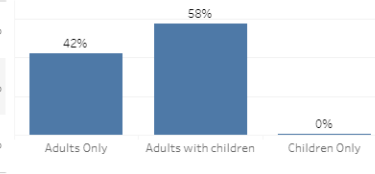
Avg Length of Stay



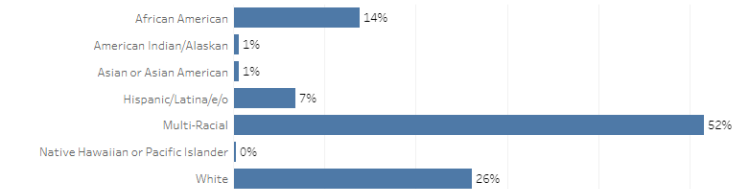
Re-enrollment Rate



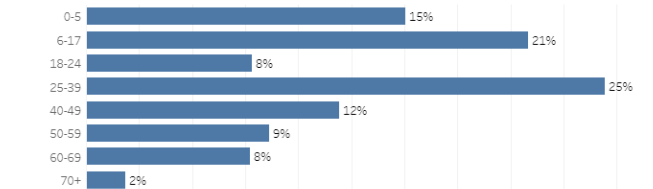

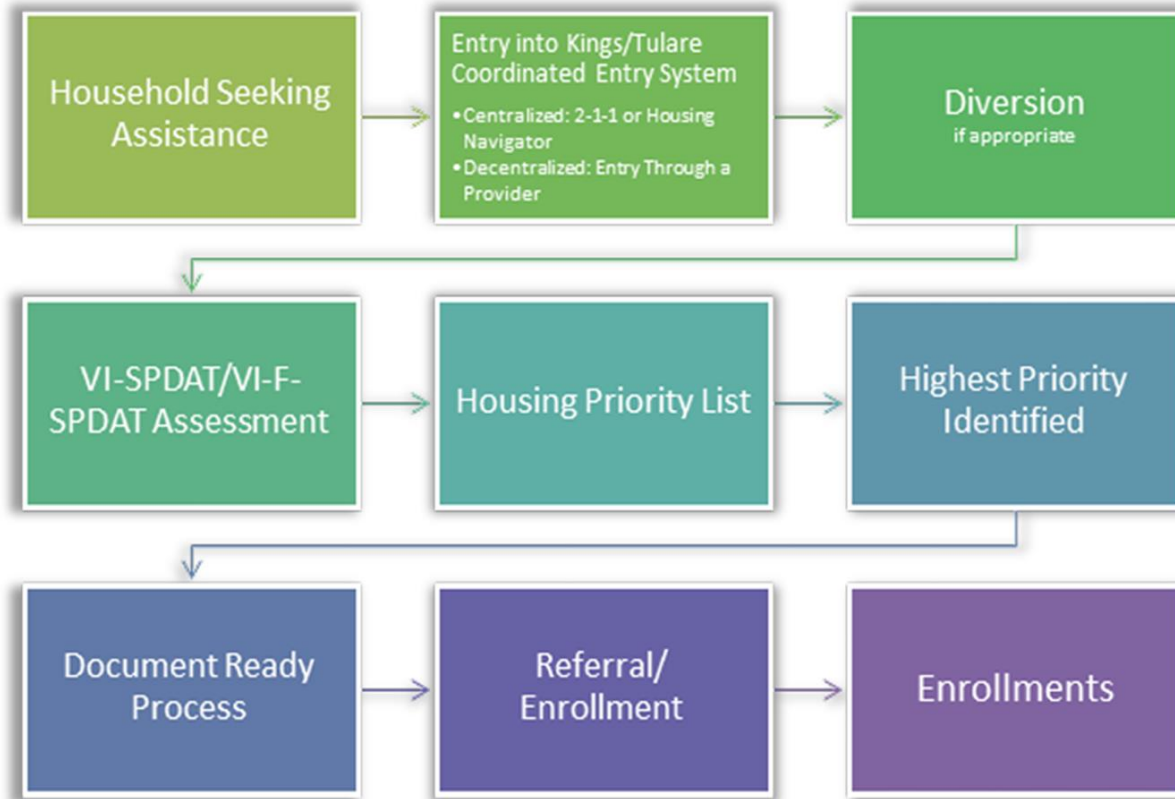

- Evictions

THE LANDLORD MITIGATION FUND

The Fund is designed to incentivize Landlords to relax screening criteria for people who are experiencing homelessness and who may have barriers that prevent them from securing housing on their own.



Financial assistance includes:

- Holding fees
- Damage reimbursements
- Legal or eviction fees
- Vacancy loss
